## FROM THE DESK OF..... **BISHOP NATHAN BAXTER**

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ:

Did you know that our Diocese of Central Pennsylvania has "institutions"? While we are essentially a diocese of congregations, we have a number of incorporated or diocesan recognized institutions which formally bear the witness of our Diocese and the Episcopal Church.

This week it has come to my attention that three of our institutions have received distinguished honors.

- Episcopal Home, Shippensburg
- Episcopal Square Apartments, Shippensburg
- Episcopal Gardens, Thompsontown (Perry Co)

The latter two are owned through HUD and are an independent corporation of the Diocese. The ministry of these institutions is outstanding in mission, efficiency and applicable govern-

The **Episcopal Home** (www.episcopalhome.com) is a seniors' assisted living community were all residents receive some form of need based financial aid. This program has been administered for more than 25 years by Canon Mary Grace Shearer, MSW. Canon Shearer is recognized as a leading expert on elder care and over the years the Home has received numerous national and local awards. Recently the Home received a report with no infractions noted in their annual, unannounced, Dept of Public Welfare inspection in June. To receive such a report is rare in the industry.

Episcopal Square (http://st-andrews-

shippensburg.diocpa.org/Become%20Involved/episcopalsquare.html) is a 2 tower independent low-income apartment complex for independent elders and disabled persons. Episcopal Gardens (Honaman House) is also a low-income independent living for seniors and disabled persons. Both have just received "Superior" rating from The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency. They will be recognized at the AHMA Fall Conference in Delaware on October 26th

We have three other institutions which provide great witness and ministry in the diocese: The Diocesan School of Christian Studies (http://www.diocesecpa.org/Our%20Programs/ school-of-christian-studies.html), providing theological education for lay and ordained ministers; and St. Stephens Episcopal **School** (www.sseschool.org), a fully accredited Pre-K to 8<sup>th</sup> grade school. The School, which serves a highly diverse student population in Harrisburg metro area, is currently pioneering a Learning Community to serve students studying through cyber-high schools for grades 9-12. The St. Barnabas Ministry Center (www.stbarnabascenter.org), located at St. Paul's Harrisburg, serves at-risk children in uptown Harrisburg. The center is a joint ministry of the Diocese and the Lutheran Synod.
